Dear Friends,

Because this newsletter covers both months December and January, it also covers the beginnings of a new liturgical year and a new calendar year. The season of Advent, which points forward to the birth of Christ and his triumphal return, begins each new liturgical year. This year, our gospel focus will be on Luke, a master storyteller and engaging writer. Luke gives us the good Samaritan, the prodigal son, the promise to the thief on the cross that he will be with Jesus in paradise, and other powerful stories of God's grace.

With the new calendar year, we will thank outgoing elders and deacons and ordain and install new officers. We are blessed to have many capable people who serve the Lord and this church faithfully through the Session and Board of Deacons. This year's transition to new leaders will be on January 5th.

The work of the church is coordinated by five primary session ministries, or committees. They are Caring, which will be chaired in 2025 by Betsy Marlowe and is primarily responsible for all the events in the Fellowship Hall that involve food -- think potluck suppers, wassail during Advent, our annual Thanksgiving feast, etc. The Caring Ministry meets on the first Monday of the month at 6:00 p.m. at church. Christian education in our congregation is overseen by the Discipleship Ministry. In 2025, Discipleship will be chaired by James Jackson. This committee reviews curriculum, approves Sunday school teachers, schedules our annual Vacation Bible School, and more. Their meetings are on the second Sunday of the month, immediately following worship. Mission and Outreach, chaired in 2025 by Laura Phipps, oversees our involvement with and benevolent giving to causes beyond our church walls such as Pasadena Community Ministries, Project Joy and Hope, and Habitat for Humanity. This ministry also has a role to play in the special denominational offerings that are collected four times a year and in outreach that we do as a congregation, such as Taco and a Prayer. Mission and Outreach meets on the second Monday of the month at 1:00 at church. The Stewardship Ministry, headed by Brett Coe, oversees the upkeep of our facility and grounds and the finances of the church. Stewardship meets on the Wednesday prior to the session meeting each month at 2:00 at the church. Our Worship and Music Ministry sounds self-explanatory. This ministry also oversees the chancel flowers, the Hanging of the Greens, and the recruitment of people to light the candles on the Advent wreath each year. In 2025 it will be chaired by Barry Webb. Worship meets by Zoom on the first Monday of each month.

All of these ministries are open to new members. Speak to one of the ministry chairs if you are interested in getting more involved. You will be enthusiastically welcomed! Like everything else in life, the more engaged each of us is in the church, the more our life is blessed. Pray for our ministries and be a blessing to others!

#### Clerk's Corner

The Session of First Presbyterian Church, Pasadena, Texas, met in a stated meeting on Monday, November 18, 2024, in the Fellowship Hall.

#### The following action items were taken.

- Brett Coe, Kashif Dean, Nancy Saldivar, elders elect for the class of 2027, and Lavinia Brown, Shannon English, Carol Parks, and Karen Taylor, deacons elect for the class of 2027 introduced themselves and shared their faith journeys. After a time for questions, a motion to sustain the examinations was approved.
- The session approved the installation/ordination of new officers on January 5, 2025, during worship.
- The session confirmed the email vote to elect Laura Phipps and Barry Webb as commissioners to the Presbytery of New Covenant meeting at First Presbyterian Church of Galveston on November 16, 2024.
- The session approved minutes of the stated session meeting on October 21, 2024.
- The communion dates for 2025 were approved, as follows: January 19, February 16, March 16, April 17-Maundy Thursday, May 18, June 15, July 20, August 17, September 21, October 5—World Communion Sunday, November 2—All Saints' Day, December 24—Christmas Eve, and homebound Communion to be served as needed.
- The session approved that Dr. Fair be authorized to do baptisms at her discretion in 2025.
- The session approved sending \$500 from budget line item 912a for Special Outreach Programs to Project Joy and Hope.
- Session approved calling the annual meeting of the congregation for February 9, 2025.
- Session approved electing Bonnie Keith to serve as Clerk of Session for 2025.
- Session approved ministry assignments as follows:

## The following reports were given.

- The current membership is 194.
- Brett reported that the October income was \$42, 258.70. The expenses were \$42,453.69 with a new loss of \$194.99 for October. A little over \$7000 was received in the special offering to defray the cost of building maintenance. November 17 was Pledge Sunday, A number of pledge cards were turned in and more are expected.
- Laura Phipps presented a report on the meeting of the Presbytery of New Covenant that was held on November 16, 2024, at First Presbyterian Church, Galveston.
- Barbara reminded elders that the due date for newsletter articles was the 20th of the month and that the next newsletter would be for December/January. Articles need to be sent to both Barbara at office@fpcpasadena.org and Betty at office2@fpcpasadena.org.

#### Seafarer Christmas Boxes - Christmas 2024 Update



Boxes, boxes, where to put them all? What a wonderful problem for the hardworking chaplains and staff of the Seafarer Center to have, and they want the problem to increase with even more boxes! You can still add boxes if you have not finished yours. Stocking caps are still available and plastic shoe boxes become an extra gift for the seafarer.

When the 76 boxes that were lovingly prepared by both congregation members individually and the ladies of the Presbyterian Women were delivered to the Seafarer Center, it brought the total of boxes received to 3,356 thus far. However, the chaplains and staff of the center are hoping for at least another 5,000 or more boxes to come in over the course of the next few weeks.

As can be seen looking at the floor, the chapel at the center is almost half full with a pile that is six foot high. The boxes from our church ended up stacked directly in front of the alter and are ready to be bagged for delivery.

Hallways, the center board room, under tables and any other empty space becomes a place to store boxes.

Every single box shown and all of the rest that will come in will be distributed by the chaplains to grateful seafarers until the supply runs out. This starts on the Monday after Thanksgiving and seafarers, especially non-Christian seafarers, are amazed to receive a gift such as this.

The Houston Seafarer Center has a world wide reputation for outstanding generosity and wonderful facilities for seafarers to rest and relax while they are in port.
