A Letter from Dr. Fair

Dear Friends.

As we look back on the year just completed and look ahead to 2025 — when we will celebrate 85 years as a congregation — our overriding emotion should be one of gratitude. We should frequently engage in call and response using the words, "God is good all the time; all the time God is good."

Overall, 2024 was a good year for First Presbyterian Church. We had uplifting worship. All of our ministries carried out important work. Seven people united with the congregation. There were multiple opportunities for study with good participation, service opportunities that were faithfully supported, and some fabulous times of fellowship.

The year got off to a good start with the ordination and installation of officers, including one newly ordained elder and three first time deacons. Brown Bag and Bible began a study of Romans in January, and we hosted the annual Pasadena Community Ministries volunteer luncheon. In February, we had a wonderful Shrove Tuesday pancake supper, followed the next night by a meaningful Ash Wednesday service. The first of March saw us gather in the Fellowship Hall for a wonderful barbecue lunch/fundraiser for the 85th anniversary with Pitmaster John Farley delighting our taste buds and doing the hardest work. The end of March was Holy Week, which culminated in a grand celebration of the Day of Resurrection on the 31st. In May our Early Childhood Program graduated another class of precious little children, we celebrated Pentecost, and served a bunch of delicious handmade breakfast tacos while offering prayers to those who wanted them at our annual Taco and a Prayer outreach event. In early June we gathered for our Super Summer Event and enjoyed a study of famous sayings that — unbeknownst to many of us — come from scripture. That multi-day event was capped off by a fabulous fish fry, thanks to our men. In June we also welcomed Betty Rodriguez to our office staff. July saw us gather in the fellowship hall for our annual 4th of July weekend hot dog and watermelon picnic. In August your nominating committee began working hard to identify those whom God was calling to serve this congregation as officers. In September we had a rally day celebration to kick off a new year of church school. In October, we joined Christian congregations from around the world for World Communion Sunday, elected elders and deacons for the Class of 2027, and prayed for them as they began a time of study and preparation. In November we remembered the saints we lost in the last 12 months with our annual All Saints' Day worship service. We also enjoyed a wonderful Thanksgiving feast and dedicated our gifts to God for 2025. In December, we observed the season of Advent, watched the light on the Advent wreath grow, and prepared for the birth of our Lord among us. Christmas Eve was a beautiful evening and a great reminder of how blessed we are to be children of God.

Throughout the year, attendance at Brown Bag was strong, as it was for our Presbyterian Women's Bible study, and our church school classes. We also offered a short class on Judaism in conjunction with Austin Presbyterian Theological Seminary that was very well attended.

A difficult part of the year was saying good-bye to beloved members of the congregation. We miss them. I think of them each time I step into the pulpit and see "their" spot in the pews. But we do not grieve as those who have no hope. We rejoice that these saints now know life everlasting in the presence of our gracious God, that pain and sadness and earthly travail are over and their victory is won.

As a minister of word and sacrament in the PCUSA, I have responsibilities beyond this congregation. I serve the Presbytery of New Covenant as the chair of the Calls and Contracts subcommittee of the Committee on Ministry, as well as serving on the Board of Directors of Brazos Presbyterian Homes as chair of their Corporate Compliance Committee and member of their Executive Committee. I also was honored to serve communion at the March meeting of the Presbytery, and we hosted (and I participated in) a Presbytery boundary training event for all church workers. For the denomination, I serve on the board of MRTI (Mission Responsibility through Investing) as a Board of Pensions representative. I took two, short, online classes in 2024, one on world religions sponsored by Wesley Theological Seminary in Washington, D.C. (and taught by a professor in Australia!) and one sponsored by Louisville Presbyterian Theological Seminary on the book *A Human-Shaped God: Theology of an Embodied God* by Charles Halton, which won the 2024 Grawemeyer Religion Award.

I anticipate the year ahead will be just as full as the year just completed. Be sure to have October 11-12 on your calendars. Those are the dates for the grand celebration of First Presbyterian Church of Pasadena's 85th Anniversary. Tica Dickman is doing a great job chairing the effort and we will have a wonderful time around the theme, REMEMBERING – REFLECTING – REJOICING!

Friends, we are blessed to be in communion with our living Lord and one another. Let us never take our bonds for granted but nurture them with the kind of love, mercy, and forgiveness our Lord shows us, while also extending such love to all those in the world around us.

Thanks to Prayer Shawl for making the hats! All of these items were delivered to the Community Pregnancy Center of Pasadena. The CPC provides cost free health services, support and counseling for women and men facing an unplanned pregnancy.

Prayer Shawl Ministry

The Prayer Shawl Ministry has faithfully met weekly in person and on Zoom. Participants include both church members and friends from outside the church. With the leading of the Holy Spirit, they have developed relationships, supported and loved one another, laughed, prayed, and crocheted, crocheted.

They have made:

- ⋄ over 50 baby hats and other items for the Bibs, Burps, Blankets & More project.

- The Stepping Out in Faith Class was led by Pastor Pat Abrams. The class has completed their study of *Paul for Everyone: 1 Corinthians by N. T. Wright and* began a study of N. T. Wright's *Paul for Everyone: 2 Corinthians*. The class is a hybrid of in-person and Zoom.
- The Men's Class (led by Mark Corder) studied *2nd Corinthians* by John MacArthur and started *Genesis 1 11* by John MacArthur.
- Current Christianity, under the leadership of Mark Clemmons studied *Elusive Grace* by Scott Black Johnson and *Unoffendable* by Brant Hanson.
- The youth meet weekly for Sunday school with Brian Davis and James Jackson leading. They use various books on a variety of topics from the PCUSA *Faith Questions* curriculum.
- The Brunch and Book Group meet monthly on Saturdays in the Fellowship Hall. They have lively discussions about books and enjoy delicious food.
- Chair and mat yoga classes were led by Carey Coker. They met on Tuesdays and Thursdays.
- Brown Bag and Bible, under the leadership of Dr. Fair, usually met at noon on Wednesdays.
- As part of the Souper Bowl of Caring initiative, the youth collected \$544.25 for Pasadena Community Ministries.
- The Summer Family Event (June 3-5) was designed to be intergenerational with Dr. Fair leading a fun filled lesson. A youth Bible study was offered with two siblings in attendance. They studied elements of Ephesian's 6 with related craft projects of a shield of faith, a breastplate of righteousness, and a sword of the spirit. Two nights a light supper was provided. On the third and last night the men of the church prepared their traditional fish fry dinner.
- Yulissa Delgado continued to do a great job in the nursery during Sunday school and worship. Continuing efforts were made to get volunteers to help.
- The Early Childhood Program reported to the session through the Discipleship Ministry.

Stewardship Ministry

The Stewardship Committee offers the following highlights and major accomplishments for 2024. The committee consists of Session Members Brett Coe (Chairman) and Roy Kreitz, along with congregational members, Marvin Clark, Bruce Walters, Tom Hoffman, Dale Sinor, and Danny Slaven.

The ongoing, strategic work of the Stewardship Committee revolves around the efforts of maintaining budget guidelines, monthly reporting of financials, facilities operation, safety, and maintenance of the church campus. Particular attention is given to building maintenance and lawn care to facilitate visitor's first impressions of First Presbyterian.

Other key highlights for 2024 were:

- <u>2025 Budget</u> Prepared the 2025 draft of the asking budget for Session review. The budget
 was brought to Session and approved. The final budget will be presented to the congregation
 in February 2025.
- <u>HVAC</u> Several key areas addressed throughout the year including a burned-out wire on a relay, a low voltage breaker tripped. Replaced the compressor for the 30-ton HVAC unit on the piano side in the Sanctuary and converted to 407C freon. Replaced filters on all (10) HVAC units. Each unit contains between 4-10 filters.
- <u>Lighting/Electrical</u> Replaced halogen bulbs in all of the parking lot lights using a rented lift.
 Replaced (2) Wall Pack lights. We experienced low voltage issues throughout the year due to
 blown fuses on CenterPoint's pole. This caused several LED lights to go out and had to be
 replaced as well as problems with photocells on our outside Wall Pack lights. The voltage
 issues also caused breakers to trip on some of our HVAC units.
- <u>Plumbing</u> Numerous toilet and faucet repairs were performed. Had a new circulation pump installed for the hot water heater. This was due to a compliance issue from the city that needed to be corrected so ECP could receive their Health Certificate (a new requirement from the state). Installed a Smart Switch to turn the pump on and off for school hours.
- <u>Information Technology (I.T.)</u> Continued support provided for software and hardware requirements. Setup new laptop for the Office Administrator and new desktop for Financial. Installed a new desktop printer for Financial. Took care of Windows, QuickBooks network and printer issues. Installed new wireless mesh network for ECP. New Sony Laser Projectors were installed in the Sanctuary.
- **<u>Fire Alarm System</u>** Our fire alarm panel had voltage issues which could not be corrected. Benco had to install a new system and replace some of the horns in the classroom wing.
- <u>Misc. Repairs</u> Replaced worn out doorstops and installed new ones. The ice machine
 required repair work. Replaced stained ceiling tiles. Replaced tile at the front entrance with an
 anti-slip tile. Replaced the damaged section of roof on the storage shed with Ice & Water
 shield and new metal roof.
- <u>Lawn Care</u> Hired tree trimmer to complete major trimming on trees in front of the church and along Preston. The trees created a potential hazard over the street. Ongoing mowing and yard services, along with limb trimming throughout the year. Special thanks to all the Mowing Team, and Roy Kreitz for his beautiful garden.

Stewardship cont.

- <u>Hurricane Beryl</u> We experienced numerous issues due to this hurricane including several
 days without power here at the church. Many hours were spent by volunteers and our custodial
 staff cleaning and preparing the church for our members to return. Below is a list of the
 damage, repairs, and clean-up after this storm:
 - Part of the fence line on north side of church blew down. The posts did not crack. Had fence guy remove concrete, prop back up, and pour new concrete. Cost \$450
 - ♦ No power and partial power (1 leg) until 7/18/2024. Partial power caused other issues.
 - -Replaced 4 LED lights-expect more issues with LED lights-Purchased 8 LED lights \$210
 - -One wall pack not working after the power outage. Will check to see if it's the photocell or wall pack
 - -AVAYA Phones Control Unit power supply died, Cost to replace \$591-AT&T modem had to be replaced. Had to set the 10 T-Stats, printers, and PC's on the network
 - -All refrigerators and freezers in the kitchen, ECP, and choir room had to be cleaned out, which Gloria did.
 - ♦ Water entered Barbara's office, the sanctuary, choir room, and Fellowship Hall.
 - Once power was restored, Gloria scrubbed the walls. This kills mold and mildew, and deodorizes.
 - Chairs along the back of the choir room had mold growing on the legs. Gloria cleaned them.
 - Water entered from the sofit above the robes in the choir room. Music that was on the ground got wet. Some robes had mildew. The robes were taken home and washed.
 - Water leak in Barbara's office was coming from a rusted out area on the internal gutter above the back corner. Was able to use Flex Seal Spray to seal the leak. Will keep an eye on the area.
 - ♦ A large fiberglass board was blown from the spire.
 - The fiberglass board put a gash in the roof above the women's restroom in the ECP wing. This caused a significant leak in the restroom. Had a roof guy patch the gash for \$100.
 - ♦ Several ceiling tiles were damaged. Replaced the worst tiles in the choir room, hallways, and women's restroom in the ECP wing.
 - Limbs torn off cypress trees in the back and few trees in front of the church. Had a tree guy cut up and haul off the cypress limbs for \$600.
 - ♦ 2 parking lights were damaged. A glass cover was torn off the light across from the ECP entrance. The pole next to the shed is leaning.
 - ⋄ Crepe Myrtles were blown over. We stood them up and staked them off. Some we had to reset several times.

Thanks go to all who have prepared, helped, and led in worship. Special thanks go to our talented choir under Marilyn Wilkins' direction, the handbell choir under Jamie Adams' direction, Ron Ollis on the organ and piano, and guest musicians.
